<u>Best Practice 2</u> Academic Year – 2018 - 2019

Title: Participation of institute in Rural Development through Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan launched by H R D Ministry, Government of India.

Goal: The College has been actively involved in Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan 2.0 launched by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The programme has been adopted by the institution with following objective:

- To participate in rural development of Nandurbar District.
- To contribute to the society through various community based rural projects.
- To disseminate innovative visionary paths to the vulnerable people.
- To develop the habits of creating new ideas through research and scientific methods.
- To bring expected social change in the adopted villages.

Context: The project has been designed and sponsored by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Our College has been selected as Participating Institute for the Abhiyan. After the selection as PI as per the guidelines given under the project the committee of 7 members had been constituted and the meeting had been called under the coordinatorship of Principal Dr. V. S. Shrivastava. In the meeting Nodal Officer, Programme Officers (Dr. V. Z. Chaudhari, Dr. S. R. Surye, Dr. M.K. Kadam, Prof. P. S. Patil, Prof. U. J. Dhagadhage) for 5 Villages had been selected. Nodal Officer Dr. M. J. Raghuwanshi focused on action plan of the projected to be implemented effectively in the selected village – Toranmal, Ranipur, Jamana, Kathi and Dab. Following points had been discussed in the meeting.

- Constituting the students members for the House hold survey of villages.
- Different project about Swachhata and village development.
- Road map of the implementation of Blood Donation camp, Medical camp and digital awareness camps in the rural, tribal area.

Practice: Under the project the selected villages have been visited by the programme coordinators along the teams of students. The house hold surveys have been conducted to understand the basic issues of the villages. In house hold survey the necessary information has

been taken for discussion and on the basis of the same developmental projects were taken for consideration to be forwarded to the Ministry. The five villages as Tornmal, Jamana, Dab, Kathi and Ranipur had been neatly surveyed from different angles with the help of local authorities. The cleanliness drive and tree plantation awareness have been in the said villages and more activities are proposed.

Evidence of Success: In the academic year 2018-19 the Institute had been selected as PI by the Ministry. The adopted villages came with good responses. The separate teams worked on the issues raised by the localities. The institute stated thinking in the direction of Waste Management, Organic Farming, Basic Amenities and educational development. For the sustainable development the institute is actively involved for which the ministry has provided regular training schedules through state agencies like IIT, Bombay.

Problems encountered and Resources Required:

Working in remote tribal area of Nandurbar District is a challenging task. During survey the problems regarding road safety and electricity load shading is encountered which are the basic needs of the villagers; ultimately it hampered the working process of the team initially. Small projects related to organic farming or biogas may bring sort of change in the overall structure of the villages. The project comes with many challenges ahead the institution is marching with its best to gain expected change in the situation of the adopted villages.
